TAFE Queensland fashion students will showcase their work at an end of year parade at the Mt Gravatt campus tonight.

More than 40 students will exhibit their own work on the catwalk that will include swim and resort wear as well as accessories.

One of the students, Jade Moffatt, recently achieved a gold medal for fashion technology at the World Skills Australia regional competition in Brisbane.

Jade will now represent TAFE Queensland at the World Skills national competition held in Sydney in June next year.
